DIEGO ABENANTE is Associate professor of Asian History at the Department of Political and Social Sciences of the University of Trieste. He is interested in the history of Islam in South Asia and in the modern politics of India and Pakistan. FEDERICO BATTERA is Associate professor of African Political Systems at the Department of Political and Social Sciences, University of Trieste, Italy. He is the author of a series of articles and chapters on Somali, Kenyan, Zambian and North-African and Middle East politics and history. He recently published on the *Journal of Asian and African Studies* and on *Contemporary Arab Affairs*.

ANNA BOSCO is Associate Professor of Political Science at the University of Florence. She teaches European Union Politics and directs (together with Susannah Verney) the magazine ‘South European Society and Politics’ (Routledge). Her most recent publication is *The Four Crises of Spain*, Il Mulino, 2018.

FABIO FOSSATI is Associate professor in Political Science at the University of Trieste, where he teaches International Relations. He has been visiting scholar at the CEPAL in Santiago and Buenos Aires, CENDES in Caracas, University of California in Berkeley, Essex University, Universidad Complutense in Madrid and OECD in Paris. He has published four books in Italian (*Mercato e democrazia in America Latina*; *Economia e politica estera in Italia*; *I conflitti armati contemporanei: quali soluzioni*, with the preface of Galtung; *Introduzione alla politica mondiale*), and one book in English: *Interests and stability or ideologies and order in contemporary world politics* (Cambridge Scholars Publishing). Moreover, he has published nearly 50 articles in International Relations and Comparative Politics journals.

LUCIO FRANZESE is Associate Professor of General Theory of Law at the University of Trieste where he teaches also Law and Economics. His main research interests concern with dichotomy between private and public (*Il contratto oltre private e pubblico*, II ed., CEDAM, Padova 2001; *Feliciano Benvenuti - Il diritto come scienza umana*, ESI, Napoli 1999; *Ordine Economico e ordinamento giuridico*, II ed., CEDAM, Padova 2005), the principle of subsidiarity (*Percorsi della sussidiarietà*, CEDAM, Padova 2012) and the issue of reconciliation quarrels (*La controversia come esperienza giuridica della conciliazione*, in "RIFD. Rivista internazionale di filosofia del diritto", 2015 pp. 488-505; *Il principio di autocomposizione delle liti tra mediazione e processo*, in "JUS", 2017 pp. 247-268).

GIUSEPPE IERACI is Full Professor of Political Science at the Department of Political and Social Sciences of Trieste University, Italy, and Visiting Professor at the Faculty of Social Sciences, University of Ljubljana. His research interests are in the fields of democratic theory, party systems and political institutions, and policy analysis.
